## KEY STEPS TO GOLD



- » Appoint a staff member Bicycle & Pedestrian Coordinator.
- » Ensure that there is dedicated funding for the implementation of all types of bicycle infrastructure recommended by the bicycle master plan.
- » Continue to expand the bike network and to increase network connectivity through the use of different types of bike lanes and cycle tracks, particularly downtown and near major centers of employment (e.g. 3rd Street, 4th Street, 7th Street and Lincoln Avenue).
- » Increase the amount of high quality bicycle parking at popular destinations throughout the community.
- >> Work with the university to offer bicycling skills training opportunities for adults regularly instead of on demand. There

are options from short videos and 1-2 hour courses to more indepth training incorporating in-classroom and on-bike instruction. Other education materials, such as the League Quick Guide, offer the opportunity to share bike education in an easily accessible format.

» Expand efforts to evaluate bicycle crash statistics and produce a specific plan to reduce the number of crashes in the community. Available tools include Intersection Magic and the Pedestrian and Bicyclist Crash Analysis Tool.
