
2018 Progress Report

Nebraska has some mixed data over the last decade, but unfortunately its more recent data paints a troubling picture for the state.

Over the last decade, each of Nebraska's federal data indicators has trended in the wrong direction, but have often been near or better than the Midwestern regional average.

While it is dangerous to read too much into one year, 2017 shows a significant drop in the rate of bicycling to work (the lowest rate in the last decade), a significant drop in federal funding for bicycling and walking (the lowest rate in the last decade), and a significant increase in the rate of bicyclist traffic fatalities (the highest rate in the last decade).


The Nebraska Bicycling Alliance's mission is to cultivate a safer, more bicycle friendly Nebraska through partnerships, education, and advocacy.
