KEY STEPS TO SILVER



- » Adopt a Complete Streets policy and offer implementation guidance.
- » Increase the amount of high quality bicycle parking at popular destinations throughout the community.
- >> Continue to expand the bike network and to increase network connectivity through the use of different types of bike lanes and cycle tracks.
- >> Expand encouragement efforts during Bike Month in partnership with local bicycle advocacy groups.
- » Launch a bike share system that is open to the public. Bike sharing is a convenient, cost effective, and healthy way of encouraging locals and visitors to make short trips by bike and to bridge the "last mile" between public transit and destinations.

- » Encourage local businesses, agencies, and organizations to promote cycling to their employees and customers and to seek recognition through the Bicycle Friendly Business program.
- » Encourage local institutions of higher education to promote cycling to students, staff, and faculty and to seek recognition through the Bicycle Friendly University program.
- » Reach out to the cycling community to get them more involved with Akron's planning and implementation of bike activities.
