KEY STEPS TO SILVER



- » Appoint an official Bicycle Advisory Committee.
- » Bicycle-safety education should be a routine part of primary and secondary education. Routes to schools and through surrounding neighborhoods should be particularly safe and convenient for biking and walking. Work with your local bicycle groups or interested parents to develop and implement a Safe Routes to School or equivalent program that emphasizes bicycling for all schools.
- » Offer bicycling skills training opportunities for adults more frequently. If there are no instructors in your region, consider getting a police officer or teacher trained.
- » Continue to expand the bike network and to increase network connectivity through the use of different types of bike lanes. Ensure smooth transitions for bicyclists between the local and

regional trail network, and the street network.

- » Encourage retail destinations to provide more secure and ideally sheltered bicycle parking for customers and employees.
- » Encourage local businesses to provide discounts for customers arriving by bicycle or promote existing bicycle discount programs.
- » Continue to expand encouragement efforts during Bike Month in partnership with local bicycle advocacy groups. Host, sponsor and encourage more bicycle-themed community events, campaigns and programs. Increase your efforts on Bike to Work Day and Bike to School Day. Ensure that all bicycle-themed community events and programs are widely advertized.
