» Focus on efforts to improve county roads for bicyclists by providing buffered, separated, and protected bicycle lanes as appropriate on county roads that serve important transportation roles within the county.

» The Park & Ride Trail Grant Program is a great step to address bicycle funding needs in Dane County. Consider whether a similar grant program would be appropriate for on-street infrastructure or if there are other bicycle funding challenges that need solutions.

» Identify a law enforcement member who would like to be a representative of the police department to the bicycling community, including engaging with city staff and bicycle

advisory committee members on bicycling-related issues.

» Designate a full-time staff person to work with communities on bicycling-related efforts. This person should leverage the excellent work done in Madison and ensure that all communities in the county are able to learn from Madison's efforts.

» Data reported on the current off-street bicycle network was inconsistent. Improving your current facilities inventory and assessing current conditions would be helpful for determining the best way to create a safe and accessible network for riders of all ages and abilities.

» Ensure that police officers report cyclist crash data and potential hazards to county staff to timely identify safety needs.
